Alaska SCTP is an organization that promotes clay target shooting sports on a competitive and scholastic level throughout the State of Alaska.

In early 2012, there were 17 states offering SCTP as a high school sport. With the introduction of SCTP in Mat-Su High Schools, Alaska will become the 18th state to offer clay target shooting sports as a sanctioned after-school activity.

Fees and Registration

- ◆ Registration begins August 27, 2012 for the Fall Season and January 7, 2013 for the Spring Season.
- ◆ Registration fees are \$200 per 10-week Season Practices.
- ◆ Competitions will be \$25 for 25 Bird Trap and 25 Bird Skeet in the Fall and 2 Rounds of 5-Stand Sporting Clays in the Spring.
- ◆ Championships will be 50 Bird Trap and 50 Bird Skeet for Fall and 100 Bird Sporting Clays Walkthrough for Spring. (Cost to be determined)
- ◆ Cost of Shells and safety equipment not included - shotguns provided.
- ◆ Other fees may apply for individual high school teams as set by the booster club or team captain.

Basic Information

- A Season will consist of 10 weeks. The Fall Season will begin the first week of October and end the second week of December with a Championship shoot. The Spring Season will begin the first week of February and end the third week of April with a Championship shoot.
- All SCTP athletes will comply with all rules governing extracurricular activities set by the school district. This will include academic requirements of 2.0 grade average, practice requirements, behavior expectations, & citizenship.
- All SCTP athletes must act in a respectful manner throughout the entire season, during school and while participating in any SCTP activity, to all faculty, coaches, officials, range personnel, teammates, competitors, and adult volunteers.
- All SCTP athletes must display a level of vigilance and responsibility in regards to practice of safe firearm handling whenever handling or in the presence of firearms.
- All SCTP athletes are expected to attend and participate in practices and competitions each Season. Fees must be paid within the first two weeks of the Season, and athletes are responsible for purchasing their own shells and safety equipment, as well as transportation to and from practices and competitions.
- All SCTP athletes are expected to participate in any fundraising activities for their team as well as Community Service Projects during the Season.

Lettering in Trap and Skeet

The following criteria must be met to qualify for a Letter in Trap and Skeet:

1. Meet all of the basic requirements (see registration packet).
2. Complete the entire Season as an active member of the team, competing in all scheduled competitive shoots as a Varsity Division athlete.
3. Exhibit exemplary behavior and good sportsmanship at all times towards all shooters, coaches and officials.
4. Show marked improvement in practice scores over the length of the Season.
5. Must have a thorough understanding of the rules of each Discipline, including Bunker Trap and International Skeet, the Olympics and Collegiate-style Disciplines.
6. Must be able to competently act as a trapper/scorer for Trap and Skeet.
7. Must participate in the Trap and Skeet Championship and Awards Banquet.

Lettering in Sporting Clays

The following criteria must be met to qualify for a Letter in Sporting Clays:

1. Meet all of the basic requirements (see registration packet).
2. Complete the entire Season as an active member of the team, competing in all scheduled competitive shoots as a Varsity Division athlete.
3. Exhibit exemplary behavior and good sportsmanship at all times towards all shooters, coaches and officials.
4. Show marked improvement in practice scores over the length of the Season.
5. Must have a thorough understanding of the rules of Sporting Clays, including FITASC (a Sporting Clays-style Discipline).
6. Must be able to competently act as a trapper/scorer for Sporting Clays.
7. Must participate in the Sporting Clays Championship and Awards Banquet.
